Over 200 excited attendees joined 60 passionate hosts and 12 vendors, creating a lively atmosphere of learning and connection. Participants embraced the opportunity to explore new skills, while hosts generously shared their knowledge and expertise. The air buzzed with shared laughter and conversation, as people from all walks of life connected and formed new friendships. This wasn't just an event; it was a vibrant celebration of the power of community. Everyone left feeling enriched, with new skills in their pocket and a renewed sense of belonging.

The weather started off a bit wet, but Friday night the skies cleared for the perfect Saturday and Sunday event! The weather was on our side and provided some splitter Arkansas spring weather.

[...continued] To help foster such a successful year we brought on several keep people to help tackle unique challenges. In the beginning of 2023, we had the pleasure of bringing on Sharon Bennett and Brandon Griffin to the Central Arkansas ambassador team. Both of them, along with long time developers Stark Ligon and Reed James, set in motion negotiations with the city of North Little Rock to hopefully open a new local climbing area.

In August, we welcomed new board member and long time Arkansas climber, John David (JD) Borgeson. With his experience as a climber and skills as an engineer, JD has proven to be an invaluable member of the ARCC board.

Along with all the work we do around the state, we are always looking to improve systems, communication, and efficiency on an internal basis. This has allowed us to continue to increase the work we do as volunteers in the community. We will forever be focused on bettering the organization and ourselves for good of the community.

2023 Brought some unique challenges to Arkansas, and we were fortunate enough to have the SCC to lean on to help us navigate the muddy waters, since they had been down such roads. And of course as always the ARCC works closely with the Access Fund! A special shout out to our Regional Manager, Brain Tickle! Brian not only manages the central region of the country, he is also the Access Funds Acquisitions Manager. No matter what, Brian is there for the board and the community even if the advice and guidance is hard to give. As I mentioned above, we learn so much every year, and much of what we learn come from the Access Fund, especially from Brain! Thank you Brain for everything you do!

The Access Fund has been closely working with us on the opening of Fitzgerald. Countless planning of trails policy, and not to mention the hard work of the Access Fund Conservation Team. This had a lot of heavy lifting to do and the Access Fund was right there with us in the trenches.

It's worth mentioning that the ARCC works with several LCOs nationwide. We are always eager to join the Access Fund Central Time Zone LCO Meetups. During these meetings, we learn a lot from other LCOs regarding their successes and failures. We are always excited to hear how other LCO's are making policies with land owners and and keeping Climbing areas safe through many creative and resourceful avenues. Everyone on the call gets really excited for when the community gets to purchase climbing areas!

We are very grateful for their recommendation. In the past, we have been in contact with the Illinois Climbers Association for event advice, Black Hills Climbers Coalition for ideas on a website platform, and the Southeastern Climbers Coalition for information on development standards, administration structuring, and land acquisition. Working with other LCOs has opened the door to many great collaborations and ideas.

The Forest Service continues to welcome climbers in all four of their districts across Arkansas, and continues to be receptive to ideas and projects we present.

We continue to work with the <u>Boston Mountain Ranger District (BMRD</u>) to develop a climbing management plan to move forward discussing a rebolt day at Fern. We are hopeful to help the BMRD with the issues of unauthorized trails and bat habitats in their district.

In 2023, we worked with the <u>Big Piney Ranger District</u> (BPRD) on several projects, including approval to make the wag bag pilot a permanent program! This was exciting news and we are now able to dig post, in approved locations, to mount the wag bag boxes. This program will help reduce human waste in the climbing areas most impacted by climbers. Please contact the board to notify us when a wag bag box needs refilled.

We hosted a trail day (Ozark Ramble) in the Cowell region with 32 volunteers! The trail crew cleaned trails from Invasion to Land of the Little People, along with Hudson Mountain trail, Power Wall trail, and helping improve the trail to Andromeda! The rebolt crew replaced 83 bolts, 49 of which were hole-for-hole (59%). 44 of those nonhole-for-hole bolts were specifically moved to create better flow and to make the route better/safer. Only 5 couldn't be replaced hole-for-hole due to technical issues. All bolts replaced used stainless steel ClimbTech wave bolts or SS" x 4.5"' Powers 5-piece. It was a massive effort over two days, and we appreciate having a forest service administration that loves climbers!




How Money Was Raised:

The ARCC board was hard at work in 2023, pursuing grant options for funding climbing, outreach, and development projects. This momentum, coupled with the Arkansas Climbers Festival, and events around the state turned 2023 into an incredible year for grants and funding. In addition, ARCC membership was over 150 annual members, with 175 members signing up - Thank You! Membership is a small yet vital component of the ARCC's revenue, and the summation of all these components allowed the ARCC to raise S133,742.23 in 2023 - no small feat.




